The infrastructure of Uniglobe College is well-distributed across five main blocks (A to E), offering a range of academic and administrative facilities. Block A features one classroom with a 48-student capacity, a small seminar hall for 30 students, a library and study room equipped with computers, 10 office rooms, and an additional study room with computer access. Block B is the most classroom-dense, comprising 12 classrooms (each accommodating 48 students), a computer lab, and a large seminar hall with a capacity of 110 students. Block C includes 6 offices, a guest room, and 2 store rooms, while Block C1 adds four more classrooms with 48-student capacities. Block D houses five classrooms (30-student capacity each), a finance lab and an incubation centre (each accommodating 4 students), 3 offices, and a seminar hall for 20 students. Finally, Block E offers four classrooms with varied capacities (15, 30, and 40 students), a computer lab, and a store room. Collectively, this infrastructure highlights the college's robust capacity to support teaching, research, and administrative operations effectively.

The ICT equipment inventory consists of 22 projectors, 30 laptops, 116 desktop computers, 31 air conditioners (AC), and 9 Smartboards. Among these, desktop computers form the largest category, reflecting the institution's significant reliance on fixed computer workstations. Laptops and air conditioners are moderately available, supporting mobility and comfort respectively, while projectors are also well-represented, likely used for presentations and teaching purposes, and Smartboards are also in good practice to enhance digital learning and classroom interactivity.

12. Observations and Recommendations

Uniglobe College demonstrates several strengths, including a high student intake in flagship programs such as BBA, BCSIT and MBA, supported by strong ICT and classroom infrastructure that facilitates effective learning. Additionally, the senior BBA batches have shown impressive pass percentages, reflecting solid academic achievement. However, there are areas that require improvement. The scholarship intake should be strategically expanded to attract and support more students. Attention is also needed to enhance the academic performance of newer BBA batches, where pass rates have declined. Furthermore, there is a need to actively promote research and publications among both students and faculty to strengthen the institution's academic reputation and scholarly output.

13. Conclusion

Uniglobe College has maintained strong enrollment and infrastructure growth. The EMIS data reflects a vibrant academic community with adequate resources. Strategic efforts are recommended in strengthening research culture, improving academic support for newer batches, and further digitizing administrative processes.

14. Future Scope

The future development of the Management Information System (MIS) at Uniglobe College is envisioned as a transformative step toward building a fully digital, centralized, and student-friendly ecosystem.

To strengthen the EMIS infrastructure, Uniglobe College has partnered with **Giga Infosoft**, utilizing their expertise to design a **robust, scalable, and future-ready system**. As part of this journey, a **digital student attendance system** is already in practice, improving accuracy and efficiency in daily academic operations.

Looking ahead, one of the key priorities is the **transition of existing modules like Accounts/Finance and Library Management** into the MIS. This shift from the current standalone software to an integrated MIS platform will not only eliminate data redundancy but also ensure smoother coordination across departments, making information more accessible and reliable.

In addition, new and advanced features are planned to enrich both operational workflows and the student experience. Some of these include:

- **Canteen Management System** – introducing a digital solution for managing daily transactions, food ordering, and inventory within the college canteen.
- **Online Fee Payment Gateway** – collaborating with multiple merchants and payment platforms to allow students and guardians to make secure fee payments online, reducing manual effort and improving convenience.
- **Enhanced Inventory System** – streamlining the monitoring and management of ICT equipment, furniture, and other resources under a centralized system.

- **Smart Library Access** – moving beyond digital cataloguing to include smart borrowing/returning systems and real-time availability updates.
- **Academic Analytics & Reports** – enabling faculty and administrators to generate data-driven insights for academic performance, attendance trends, and resource utilization.
